External Validation

This term a significant amount of time has been spent compiling evidence for External Validation, the Department's self-assessment process. External Validation provides an opportunity for schools to discuss their judgements about the school's practice - and the evidence that underpins them - with a panel of peers.

Once during a five-year cycle, schools undergo an External Validation of the evidence of their school's assessment of progress. An independent panel comprising of a Principal, School Leadership (PSL) and a peer principal considers the school's evidence using the standards articulated in the School Excellence Framework.

The report is due at the end of this term and the panel meeting will take place on Tuesday 23rd October.

My students had a wonderful time at the Hawkesbury Animal Shelter last Wednesday and are very much looking forward to returning in a couple of weeks. We were able to complete two 30 minute reading sessions with the dogs and the results were amazing. The children commented on how the dogs settled down as time went on and we are hoping this will assist in them eventually being adopted out. We are hoping those same dogs are no longer at the shelter on our return.

All my students took on the reading task with great enthusiasm and showed great empathy for each and every animal. They were keen to swap books when they had finished their own, so that they could continue to read to the dogs. They were also able to choose different dogs to read to in the second session. We finished our visit by giving each and every dog a special chewy treat.

The shelter staff were also very impressed with how the students listened to important instructions and approached their tasks. We are hoping each student can bring along a special toy from home on our final visit, to leave with the dogs.

The staff have also promised that we will be allowed to access the cattery to play with the kittens on this day. If any parents don't want their children to access this area of the shelter for any reason, please let us know before the visit.
